THE BAPTIST CHURCHES OF QUÉBEC

The first Baptist church in Lower Canada (Québec) opened in Stanstead in 1794, followed by Abbott's Corners in 1796 or 1798 - Frelighsburg opened in 1799, all were ministered by Baptist missionaries from Vermont and Northern New York - In 1831 the Baptists were present in Montréal - The Grande Ligne French Baptist Mission was opened in 1835 - The Canada Baptist Missionary Society was organized in 1837, with headquarters in Montréal - In 1845, the Baptists were present in Québec City - In 1888 the Baptist Convention of Ontario and Québec was formed.

THE BAPTISTS IN LOWER CANADA IN 1861

In 1861 the total number of Protestants in Lower Canada (Québec) stood at 15.1% of the total population - The Anglicans were the largest at 38.8% of the total Protestant population, the Presbyterians at 26%, the Methodists at 18.3%, the Baptists at 4.6% (source: Michael Gauvreau, The Canadian Protestant Experience 1760-1990, edited by George A. CITIES, TOWNS, VILLAGES

Abbott's Corners – Abbott's Corners' Baptist Church – Missisquoi - A village first settled about 1795 or most likely earlier by American settlers and located about 2 km east of Frelighsburg. All that exist today as a memorial to the past is an old Baptist church building and two Protestant cemeteries. Abercorn – Abercorn's Union Church – Brome - A village on the Vermont border first settled in 1810 and located within Sutton township near East Pinnacle. The town was originally named Shephard's Mills - Union Church was organized in 1870 by Baptist, New Connexion Methodist, Congregationalist missionaries - Eastern Townships Resource Centre - Lennoxville - ETRC United Church Archives - Lennoxville #UC-076 Union Church Abercorn - BAnQ books of burials; Abercorn Old Cemetery (1809-1939), Abercorn Johnson Cemetery (1839-1977) - Abercorn Old Cemetery http://missisquoigenealogy.blogspot.ca/2010-01/abercorn-cemetery-abercornbrome-county.html -

Asbestos – Free Will Baptist - **Richmond** - A large town at the northern end of the county on the border with Drummond county - In 1837 Baptist missionaries arrived - In 1861 a Baptist church opened - no known surviving parish registers - see Danville or Kingsey for most likely sources of acts of births, marriages, deaths - **Protestant families of Richmond County -** Indexes of marriages, baptisms, deaths 1820-1925 - see; http://www.institutdrouin.com/neufs/cote.php?cote=N-0753

Ascot Corner - Baptist Missionaries – Sherbrooke - A town first established about 1803 and located within Ascot township, east of the cities of Sherbrooke and Lennoxville on the border with Compton county - In 1810 a Baptist mission opened - About 1850 a Baptist church was opened - Church registers under Sherbrooke Baptist Church - BAnQ films (1850 & 1872 & 1888-1941) - Quebec Records (1850 & 1872 & 1888-1941) - Ancestry.ca (1850 & 1872 & 1888-1941) - St. Francis District Protestant Families 1815-1879 - #9 baptisms, #10 marriages, #11 deaths - see; http://sgce.whc.ca/rep11.htm

Ayer's Cliff - Way's Mills Union Church - Stanstead - A village first settled in the early 1800's and located north of Stanstead, east of Coaticook and south of Hatley - Was originally named Landmaid's Flat - In 1881, the Baptists shared the Way's Mills Union Meeting House with members of the Congregationalist and Adventist Churches - BAnQ films under Adventist Church (1884-1925) - Quebec Records (1884-1925 Adventist Church) - **Ancestry.ca** (1884-1925 Adventist Church) -

Ayersville - **Baptist Mission** - Église Baptiste Évangélique - Argenteuil - A small village located west of Lachute - From 1886 and 1961, the Baptists were present with a church in Ayersville - see Lachute for parish registers - Laurentian Region Protestant Families - marriages #R-12 - 1900-1992 - 846 pages - 2 volumes - see; http://sglaurentides.org/publications

Bagot - **Bagot Missionaries** - **Bagot** - The county is not part of the Eastern Townships, it's "L shape" touches the borders of Drummond to the east, Yamaska to the north, Shefford to the south, St-Hyacinthe to the west - Baptist missionaries arrived in 1845 - no known surviving church documents under Bagot, see Saint Pie (St. Pie) as the most likely source of surviving parish registers for Baptist families of this region within the time period of 1845-1912

Baldwin's Mills – Free Will Baptist Missionaries – Stanstead - A village first settled in 1810 or about and located on the Vermont border, east of Stanstead Village and Rock Island - In 1838 Free Will Baptist Missionaries arrived - No known surviving church documents under Baldwin's Mills - see Stanstead Village and Stanstead County - Stanstead County Protestant Families - 1845-1963, see; http://www.colbycurtis.ca/shs/archives.php

Bedford - Standbridge East Baptist Missionary Society - Missisquoi - Town first settled about 1800 and incorporated as a village in 1812 and located a few km north of St. Armand and a few km

west of Dunham - In 1843, the Baptists opened a church - **BAnQ** films under Stanbridge & Stanbridge Ridge Baptist Church (1842-1853) - **Missisquoi Historical Society** (1842-1849)- see; http://www.museemissisquoi.ca/index.html

Beebe Plain - Temperance Society - Baptist Church – Stanstead - A village on the Vermont border east of Lake Memphremagog, west of Stanstead, south of Tomifobia and Ogden. Berthier – Église Baptiste du Maskinongé in Berthier & Brandon (St-Gabriel-de-Brandon) -Maskinongé–Berthier - Also referred to as Berthierville and located on the St. Lawrence River in the region of Louiseville - In 1892, Baptist missionaries were present in the region - see; Maskinongé -Rivière-du-Loup-en-haut - BAnQ Gatineau book of marriages (1823-1831) - see; http://www.genealogieoutaouais.com/?spage=22

Birchton – **Birchton Union Church Society** – **Compton** - A village within Eaton township and located south of Sandhill, east of Johnville, west of Cookshire, north of Eaton - In 1879 Baptist missionaries were present within the Union Meeting House with the participation of the Baptist, Congregationalist and Methodist church societies. The Meeting House was also used by the Anglicans for a short period of time - Eastern Townships Resource Centre - ETRC Lennoxville Archives #UC-017 - content not reported - St. Francis District Protestant Families - 1815-1879 - #9 baptisms, #10 marriages, #11 deaths - see; http://sgce.whc.ca/rep11.htm

Bolton – **Baptist Missionaries** - **Temperance Movement** - **Baptist Congregation** – **Brome** - A village within Bolton township, located east of Bolton Glen, south of Foster Mountain and Grass Pond - It was first settled in 1808 - In 1830 Baptist missionaries arrived - In 1832 the Temperance Movement opened a church - In 1861 a Baptist congregation opened - **BAnQ** films under Bolton Baptist Church (1845-1863 & 1861-1869 & 1864-1869 & 1941-1943) & under West Bolton Adventist Church (1904-1930) - **Quebec Records** (1845-1863 & 1864-1869 Bolton Baptist Church & 1904-1930 Adventist West Bolton) - **Ancestry.ca** (1845-1863 & 1864-1869 Bolton Baptist Church & 1904-1930 Adventist West Bolton) - **BAnQ** book of marriages (1861-1869) - **Missisquoi Historical Society** films under Bolton Baptist (1861-1879) - see; http://www.museemissisquoi.ca/ index.html - see also South Bolton

Brome Village – Free Will Baptist Missionaries – Brome - A village within Brome township. Brookbury - **Baptist Church** of **Bury** - **Compton** - A hamlet of the 1840s located south of Dudswell, west of North Hill, east of Crossbury, north of Hardwood Flat within Bury township - Baptists were present in the region with a Baptist church in nearby Bury Village (see Bury Village - Lingwick - Gould) - **BAnQ** film (1896-1901) - **Quebec Records** (1896-1901) - **Ancestry.ca** (1896-1901) - **St. Francis District Protestant Families** - 1815-1879 - #9 baptisms, #10 marriages, #11 deaths - **Protestant baptisms** 1815-1994 #56 - 510 pages - **Protestant marriages** 1816-1994 #57 - 261 pages - **Protestant deaths** 1800-1994 #58 - 355 pages - see; http://sgce.whc.ca/rep11.htm

Brownsburg – Maple Avenue Baptist Church – Argenteuil - A village established in 1818 and located northwest of Lachute. The town was also referred to in the early years as Brownsbury - In 1877, the first Baptist church opened, the second in 1944 - BAnQ Montréal film (1936-1942) - BAnQ Gatineau film (1936-1942) - Quebec Records (1936-1942) - Ancestry.ca (1936-1942) - BAnQ book of marriages (1928-1991 Maple Avenue Baptis & 1952-1991 Second Baptist Church) - QFHS book of marriages REF #GS-157.3 L3 (1900-1992) - see; http://www.genealogieoutaouais.com/?spage=22

Buckingham Township – Baptist Circuit Ministry – Papineau - A village first settled in 1802 and located then within Wright township (Hull) - In 1822 and 1898, the Baptists opened a mission and a church - BAnQ Montréal film (1898-1938) - BAnQ Gatineau film (1898-1938) - BAnQ Online Parish Registers (1900-1912) - see; http://www.genealogieoutaouais.com/?spage=22

Bulwer – Baptist Circuit Ministry & Free Will Baptist Missionaries - Compton – A village within Eaton township and located east of Johnville, south of Sandhill, west of Birchton and north of Eaton -Free Will Baptist missionaries arrived in 1833, in 1845 a permanent mission was operational and in 1867 a church opened - BAnQ film (1867 1894) - St. Francis District Protestant Families marriages, baptisms, deaths # 9, #10, #11 (1815-1879) - see; http:sgce.whc.ca/livres.htm

Bury Village-Lingwick-Gould – Temperance Society - Baptist Missionaries – Compton -Region established in 1803 by Scottish immigrants and located in the vicinity of Westbury and Lingwick. The region is also referred to as Robinson - In 1833 Baptist missionaries arrived, in 1845 a Baptist church opened - BAnQ film (1914-1940) - Quebec Records (1914-1940) - Ancestry.ca (1914-1940) - St. Francis District Protestant Families - 1815-1879 - #9 baptisms, #10 marriages, #11 deaths - see; http://sgce.whc.ca/rep11.htm
