Châteauguay Literary and Historical Society

On October 26th, 1888, the Châteauguay Literary and Historical Society was organized at Ormstown, Quebec, to foster Canadian patriotism by encouraging the study of Canadian history and Canadian literature. The Society began its labours at home, taking as its subject the battle whence it derives its name. Mr. W.D. Lighthall, M.A., B.C.L., an honorary member, was asked to prepare an account of that victory, and kindly responded by his lecture, which he delivered before the Society on March 8th, 1889. Pleasure is now felt in offering this lecture, in the interests of the Society, to the Canadian world, no apology being required at a time when patriotic literature is in great demand. Mr. Lighthall's researches have been discussed by the members, and the belief is prevalent that his work touching this important item of history, in so far as accuracy is concerned, stands unrivalled, the previous authorities having been carefully compared and their testimony put together.



THE Gleaner

since/depuis 1863

Founded 157 years ago in 1863, The Gleaner has been the voice of the English-speaking community in the Chateauguay Valley since its inception. During the newspaper's history, it has been published under different names, including the Canadian Gleaner and the Huntingdon Gleaner, but has always included the word "Gleaner" in its masthead.

At first, the newspaper was a locally-owned family business, and its first editor was Robert Sellar, author of *The History of the County of Huntingdon and the Seigniories of Chateauguay & Beauharnois* (1888). The Sellar family continued in that same position for many years, eventually succeeded by other local owners until it was purchased by a succession of media chains starting in the 1980s.

After being transformed from a newspaper into an insert in regional French-language weekly, The Gleaner was eventually closed in November 2018.

In May 2019, however, The Gleaner returned to its roots as a community newspaper and is now owned and operated by the Chateauguay Valley

Community Information Services (CVCIS), a non-profit organization which purchased the rights to The Gleaner from its previous owner. The Gleaner is now published as a newspaper and as a website as part of the CVCIS's objectives to serve the regional community by: Providing quality information, news and features on topics that are important to the communities within and neighbouring the MRC Haut St-Laurent. We are promoting the pursuit of excellence when publishing content in written, audio and visual formats via a newspaper, website, community radio/television or other appropriate media. We hope to contribute towards enhancing the quality of life in the targeted communities and promoting the social, cultural and artistic richness of the region by giving the community access to locally relevant news and information that reflects their needs and interests.
