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Jacques Morin – Leveright Piuze, surgeon and apothecary with a birth on February 5, 1754 in Warsaw (Poland). At birth he was baptized as Traugott Leberecht Behzer – Married on the 14th of November 1786 with Marie-Anne Aubut in Sainte-Anne-de-la-Pocatière (La Pocatière), Québec, and they had 14 children. Died 22 April 1813 at Rivière-Ouelle, Lower Canada. Leveright Piuze spent part of his childhood in Warsaw and then lived in Dresden (German Democratic Republic), where his family moved around 1763. There, from 1767 to 1772, he trained as a surgeon and apothecary under the guidance of one of his father's close relatives. In 1781 he went to live in Rivière-Ouelle – a village without a doctor since 1761 – with the intention of establishing a medical practice > Biographi.ca
